CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT REMINDER

You don't want to be the one who kept the chapter from getting the **Society President's Award** just because you didn't get around to sending in your CPD Application, do you?

It's quick and easy- I just did it myself. You don't have to verify your points (the Society does a random check of veracity) just list them and total up your points.

This should be of special note to those who got their designation in Hawaii- your automatic qualification runs out this year.

Here are some ways in which you might have accumulated many points: (you need a total of 60 in the last year, or in the last two years for first time qualifiers):



CPCU Society annual meeting (20 points)



Pass national insurance related **exam** (40 points)



Complete 3 credit hour university course in insurance or business related

subject (37 1/2 points)



Attend 8 chapter meetings (8 points)



Attend 6 hour educational meeting of CPCU Society or other insurance organi-

zations (6 points)

There should be enough of us who have earned the 60 points to make the 20% of membership required to qualify for the award. All that is needed is to have the applications sent in (they were distributed with a recent Chapter-Gram). Just do it!

RISK MANAGEMENT COURSES

Two totally different Risk Management study groups are now being formed.

INTRODUCTIONTO RISK MANAGEMENT is one of the newer courses being offered by the Insurance Institute of America. It is designed primarily for those now to the study of Risk Management. It is appropriate for newcomers to the business as well as more experienced "students" with

no formal "RM" education.

Sponsored by the Insurance Association of Greater

Des Moines, this "short course" lasts only 8 weeks including the test, given when "requested".

The first night will be Monday February 15,



1998 at 3:30 meeting at Brooks-Lussem Insurance conference room - The total cost is \$55, which includes Text & Tests. (No local fees)

RISK MAN-AGEMENT 4 will also be available if there is enough interest. This course is part of a 3semester

course leading to the "ARM" designation.

Plans tentatively call for sessions to be on Tuesday's at 3:30 at the Reynolds & Reynolds offices, 300 Walnut in Suite 200. The costs of books is about \$100 with another \$86 for the National Exam on May 3, 1999. (No local fees will be charged)

Because this is a 13week traditional format, the starting date will be around January 25th in order to cover the subject matter.
